

## What is GPA?

A Student's Grade Point Average (GPA) is a way of converting a student's grades into a numerical scale. Grades in each high school course are converted to a number from 0.0 to 5.0 and averaged creating one cumulative score, which is the GPA. The traditional unweighted GPA scale ranges from 0.0 to 4.0.



All grades on the transcript are calculated into the student's GPA. The weighted grading scale is as follows: standard courses are weighted at 4.0, honors courses at 4.5, and Dual Enrollment courses at 5.0.

## **Career and College Promise**



### What is Career and College Promise (CCP)?

- The Career and College Promise (CCP) Program allows qualified juniors and seniors to be enrolled in high school and earn tuitionfree college credits at the same time. Many courses earn <u>both</u> high school and college credit.
- Students select courses from a wide variety of CCP Pathways.
- Students can earn college credit through one of nine college transfer pathways with NC Career and College Promise that can then transfer to all public universities, as well as many private colleges or universities in North Carolina.
- Students can also choose to earn **tuition-free** credits toward many career technical pathways offered at CVCC.



### Who can participate in CCP?

- High School students in a North Carolina public, private, or home school setting with a cumulative, unweighted high school GPA of 2.8 (or higher) or with approved assessment scores.
- The 2.8 GPA requirement can be waived for Career Technical Education (CTE) Pathways by the high school principal.

### **Important CCP Guidelines**

- The intent of the CCP program is for students to complete their chosen pathway(s).
- Once students complete the courses in a pathway, students can then take other courses in the related diploma or degree program.
- After completing two courses in the CCP program, students must maintain a 2.0 CVCC GPA to remain eligible.
- Grades of "C" or higher are needed for courses to transfer to other educational institutions.



## Points to consider before committing to CCP:

- **Tuition** is waived in the CCP program. However, there are other costs. Be sure you know the costs before you commit.
- A CCP Fee is payable for **each** semester (fall, spring, summer) that a student participates in CCP, regardless of the number of courses taken.
- CCP Fees have not yet been determined for 2025-2026
- A \$10-\$35 graduation fee is charged for completed credentials.
- Textbook/Materials fees vary by program and pathway.



### Points to consider before committing to CCP:

- You will be starting your college transcript which will forever be part of your educational record!
- Online courses and seated courses held on the CVCC campus will follow the CVCC calendar.
- Attend your CVCC classes. There are no excused absences.
- Commit to checking your CVCC email and Blackboard frequently.
- College classes typically do not accept late work. Be sure to meet all course deadlines.
